time. Epiphany's gospel readings all offer miraculous moments such as Jesus' baptism, Jesus' presentation in The Temple, and The Transfiguration. On the other hand, Epiphany is coincidentally <u>Ordinary Time</u>. Such time is ordinary given that it occurs outside of the church calendar's major seasons (Advent, Christmas-tide, Lent, Easter-tide). We live out our Christian faith and into Christ's baptism, life, death, and resurrection in our ordinary lives. Many such days are cloudy and unpredictable.

This New Year offers us many opportunities and challenges to contemplate and act upon with (extra)ordinary thoughts, words, and deeds. I think 2020 is a really keen time to consider how to be present to our lives with the best vision we can possess. (pun intended). It is an election year – fraught with deep political and sociological divisions. Humanity must choose whether we will adopt different ways of living on this planet and accept the consequences of continued climate change. We are eradicating hundreds of plants and animals.

Closer to home, Christ Memorial has its own set of decisions to make and act upon in the new decade. The parish is blessed with abundant financial and operational resources – much more so than most of the other churches in the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania. Yet, Sunday attendance and participation in Christian Education programs is generally stagnant. Christ Memorial possesses capacity to exercise authentic leadership in the diocese's Shaped by Faith initiatives. Does this church yearn to collaborate with nearby Episcopal and ecumenical partners to achieve optimal congregational vitality that is collaborative and mutually beneficial inside and outside of Christ Memorial's walls and

worship? Even closer in still – each of us should take time while we're cozy in our heated and well-lit homes to resolve what objectives we seek to establish for ourselves in the coming days and decade. How will we best balance the messiness and miraculous manner of being human beginning on Jan. 1, 2020?

I've spent a great deal of time while I've been with you studying and practicing Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT). CBT provides practitioners techniques and tools for contending with and overcoming trauma and daily problem-solving. Simplistically a person considers and acts upon what internal and external factors and emotions trigger their thoughts and behaviors as well as the consequences of their behavioral reactions and responses. This work requires emotional resilience.

I think about observing, analyzing, and intervening into such practices as striving to allow God to shine a bit of light onto my daily life. Spending time with these practices

provides openness to experiencing mini-epiphanies. If you're interested in resolving to develop greater resilience, I encourage you to complete the VIA Institute on Character's

Strengths Survey during the first week of 2020. This assessment will offer you a clear perspective on what are your greatest virtues as well as areas of your life that you can apply these strengths to become more resilient and wholehearted. Similarly, I encourage everyone who is a friend or member of Christ Memorial to attend this year's annual meeting on Jan. 19, 2020. The church has many things to consider and act upon. Some things are simple like whether the second service should begin at 10 am or 10:30 am. Some things are more opportune such as contributing to the development of the parish's Year with The Saint John's Bible. Other things are more adventurous and illuminating, including developing a stronger understanding and support for Christ Memorial's engagement with Shaped by Faith processes.

My prayer for everyone at Christ Memorial is that 2020 will illumine a bright and daring path into the possibilities and pitfalls of the New Year and daring '20s. May God grant us creative aspirations. May Christ open our hearts, minds, and bodies to proclaim The Gospel. May the Holy Spirit nudge and nourish with God's breath and delightful Love. May we gain and express our gifts to shine through winter's clouds into the hearts of other people and the world around us.

Opening: Father Jim opened with prayer and reflection.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the October meeting on October 13th were previously distributed. Motion made by Kathy and seconded by Jen to accept minutes as submitted. Motion passed 5/0/0.

Reports:

1.Treasurer's Report:

- a.Credit Cards- The cards with \$2,500 are currently being processed. One card will be provided to Michelle.
- b.Giving- The pledge campaign was started this morning. Parishioners received statement and pledge card. Web/online giving is available. Doug has 50 envelopes to district should a parishioner request them.
- c.Check Received- We received a check from Central Susquehanna Community Foundation, and it was deposited into our money market. The current total is \$275,000.
- d.Profit and Loss- Doug reviewed the reason for the numbers on the fair share budget line (we did not give from last year) and we are well over on the maintenance and repair line because of the door project taking longer than anticipated.
- e. Money Market- Father Jim suggested having a conversation about the money in the money market in January.
- f.Bookkeeping- Jen may potentially quite her position. It was mentioned that she has trouble effectively communicating with other individuals. Father Jim will contact Lane who does the bookkeeping for St. Paul's (Bloomsburg)

1.Priest in Charge's Report:

- g.Parish Life- Parish is healthy!
- h.St. John's Bible and the Shape by Faith Work- The open house had others joining us from outside the parish. There were some "seeds planted" that may bear new fruit. The schedule for the St. John's Bible needs to get out of the church walls.
- i. Services Judy's service will occur next Tuesday at 7:00pm. Father Jim would like to have the Christmas services here at our sanctuary.
- j. Diocesan Convention Update- The convention was all about the Shape by Faith initiative

Senior Warden:

Budget- Dave spent a lot of time working with Victor on the budget.

Saint Paul's/ Christ Memorial Update- blending vestries

Shaped by Faith- next meeting is the 24th at Lewisburg

Junior Warden: A written report was submitted as follows:

The following were accomplished:

- · Church heat was regulated for the season.
- · Wall air unit in office was serviced due to a water leak. New door was ordered for unit in community room.
- · Orkin Pest Control contract was established due to a report of mouse droppings found in the sacristy, as well as follow-up after treatment for bugs found in church last year. Quarterly service began on 11/09/19 for the rectory and the church.
- · Roof flashing above Pine Street door was repaired 11/2/19. The contractor also found and repaired loose flashing on the other side of the same gable. A final report will be sent to the church insurance company.
- · Sound system microphones had been ordered since spring, but on backorder. A second face mike was picked up from Gelnett for All Saints Sunday, but it was discovered that we had no battery pack that fit with the mike. A technician from Gelnett came 11/9/19 to re-evaluate our equipment. We will be receiving new battery packs and lapel mikes; current hand-held mike is sufficient. All new equipment will comply with new FCC regulations.
- · Replacement doors for 4 damaged rectory kitchen cabinet doors were ordered from Lewisburg Builders Supply.

Upcoming plans:

- Church and rectory gardens will be cleared and cleaned for fall by landscaper.
- · Contract with Orkin for spring and fall exterior treatment. Ehrlich has already treated for this fall.
- · Contractor will be called for repair of broken lantern lamp outside Market street doors, as well as broken anchor and light bulb outside Pine Street Stained glass window.
- · Telephone conference with Lezzer Doors representative planned for 11/12/19 to further refine electronic door program.
- · Replacement doors will be installed in rectory kitchen.
- · Community room entrance to be cleaned out- searching for new location for all that is there.

- · Evaluate contents of basement beyond diapers.
- · Explore cost of refurbishing the west doors in the worship space (2020).
- · Clean out grease trap in basement underneath kitchen.
